offers us grace upon grace. As our scripture says we are given this grace at the beginning of time, not because anything we have done but by the overwhelming grace and love of our Lord.

Before you could even talk, you were granted the grace of God. He brings to us life abundantly. Remember this week that there is nothing that can separate you from the love of God.
